The Construction Safety Councils are offering a new scholarship for full tuition and fees for one student in the **145 Hour Construction Safety Administrator Course**, a course that has prepared scores of construction professionals to work in the critical area of health and safety both on site and in the corporate safety environment.

The scholarship is named after and honors the memory of John Michael Maronic, who recently lost his long battle with cancer at age 59. He is remembered by his family, friends and professional colleagues as a tireless advocate for safer and healthier workplaces for all working men and women. He had a distinguished career of over 20 years with the U.S. Department of Labor – Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA). This scholarship will help ensure that his legacy will endure through the many lives that will be protected in the future with the skills and knowledge the program will impart.
